ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills program/club or any other Basic Skills program/club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All **SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8** must skate at highest level passed and **NO** official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

Skaters in other events may skate at highest level passed **OR** one level higher **BUT** not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

Please note: If a skater competes at a non qualifying competition in a “Beginner or No Test” category, then that skater must compete at the equivalent or higher level in a Basic Skills approved competition.

ENTRIES AND FEES - All entries must be postmarked no later than October 1, 2010. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organizers and will be assessed a \$15 late fee. The first event is \$40.00 and each additional event is \$15.00. **NO refunds after closing date unless event is cancelled by Pepsi Ice Midwest.** **ENTRY FORMS MUST BE FILLED OUT COMPLETELY** and returned with fee check made payable to Pepsi Ice Midwest. There will be a \$25.00 fee for returned checks.

AWARDS – Everyone will receive an award. All events will be final rounds. Medals will be awarded to first, second, and third places. ALL other places will receive ribbons. ALL awards will be presented at appropriate times throughout the competition.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS - Information regarding groups and skating times will be emailed out to coaches and posted at Pepsi Ice Midwest no later than November 16, 2009.

PRACTICE ICE – 20 min. practice ice sessions will be available for \$5 per session prior to the start of the competition. Exact times to be determined. We recommend signing up for practice ice with your entry as space will be limited. **Music will not be played on the practice ice sessions.**

MUSIC - The music for all free skating programs and showcase must be provided on CDs by the skater. CDs should be clearly marked with the name of the skater, event entered and length of music (not skating time). Competition music is to be turned in at the time of registration. Time duration is always ± 10 seconds.

VIDEO TAPING AND PHOTOGRAPHS – On Ice and Award Photos plan to be taken and be available for purchase at the rink the day of the competition. At this time, videotaping will not be provided. Please make your own video arrangements.

- The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified.
- To be skated on full ice
- Vocal music is allowed
- The skater may use elements from a previous level
- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- Time: 1:00 +/- 10 seconds

- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- *Skaters may have the option to skate one level higher in compulsories than their free skate program*

Test Track Music Event

Skaters may enter EITHER test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but NOT both during the same nonqualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice, vocal music permitted.

Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

- 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.

ARTISTIC EVENTS:

Artistic events are to be skated to music on full ice. Vocal music is allowed. Use of skating skills to develop a theme and interpret the music and effectiveness of the costume will be reflected in the marking. Handheld props only. Credit for difficult jumps and spins will be based solely on their choreographic effectiveness, not on difficulty. This event may be combined.

Basic Skills 1-8 Artistic Event: 1 min. +/- 10 sec.

Limited Beginner, Beginner, Pre-Preliminary, and Preliminary event:
1.30 max

SPIN EVENTS:

Test requirements same as those listed in Free Skate. Elements will be skated without music and without stopping between spins. **Spins may be performed in any order and only once.** Repetition of failed spins will be penalized. Only those transitions affecting entrance and exit of spins will be judged. All spins minimum 3 revolutions. The revolutions of the spin will be counted, once the skater is in position.

1. Two foot spin (3 revs)
2. One foot upright spin –optional entry & free leg position (3 Revs)
3. Forward Pivot

Beginner Spins (1 min. max):

1. One foot upright spin- optional entry & free leg position (3 Revs)
2. Beginning Back spin (2 Revs)
3. Forward sit spin (3 Revs)

Pre-Preliminary Spins (1 min. max):

1. One-Foot upright spin (3 Revs)
2. Back scratch spin (3 Revs)
3. Forward sit spin (3 Revs)

Preliminary Spins (1:15 min. max):

1. Forward camel spin (3 Revs)
2. Forward sit spin (3 Revs)
3. One Foot Forward scratch spin (3 Revs)

JUMP EVENTS:

Test requirements are the same as those listed in Free Skate. **Jumps must be skated in order.** The skater will have two attempts at each jump with only the best jump of each being judged. This is not a mini-program. Only the stroking and edges necessary to prepare for the jumps are allowed. Extra moves and connecting steps will be penalized. Skater may not change the jump chosen after the first attempt. Jumps will be performed on ½ ice. 1.5 minutes max.

1. Waltz Jump
2. ½ Flip
3. Waltz Jump – Toe Loop Combination

Beginner Jumps

1. Salchow
2. Loop
3. Flip – Toe Loop Combination

Pre-Preliminary Jumps

1. Loop

3. Single-single combination (no axel)

Preliminary Jumps

1. Flip
2. Lutz
3. Single-single combination (axels permitted)

INTERPRETIVE PROGRAM:

COMPETITION RULES

The Organizing Committee must pre-select and edit musical choices appropriate for these events. During warm-up skaters will hear selection of music twice. Following the warm-up all skaters except for the first skater will be escorted to a soundproof locker room or another area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time and then perform a program to the music. As each skater performs the next skater in line will be allowed to hear the music for the third time before they perform to the music. The listening skater will not be allowed to view the performing skater.

LEVELS:

Levels should be broken by ability with ages divided appropriately.

JUDGING RULES:

Skaters are judged on originality, pattern, technical (the ability to include jumps and spins) and music interpretation/expression.

Spins and jumps performed must be appropriate to competition level.

TIMING:

Music Duration Limited Beginner- No Test: 1:15 minute

Pre-preliminary- Preliminary: 1:30 minute

COACHING RULES: There is to be no instruction allowed during this event from coaches, parents, or fellow skaters. Staging area must be kept clear except for ice monitor and listening competitor.

BEGINNER SYNCHRONIZED SKATING

Required elements – Each level has specific required elements that must be completed:

BEGINNER 1 (majority under 9; 1 ½ - 2 minutes; 8 – 16 skaters):

- CIRCLE: Include a 2-foot turn and a forward inside and/or outside edge glide
- LINE: Cover the ice, all forward skating
- BLOCK: Cover the ice, only 1 configuration allowed
- WHEEL: A 4-spoke wheel with backward pumps
- INTERSECTION: 2 lines facing each other, 2 foot glide at the point of intersection.

Restrictions:

- Additional elements are not allowed
- Holds allowed: Shoulder-to-shoulder and hand-to-hand only
- Changes of rotational direction and traveling within elements are not allowed.
- Steps or moves from Basic 6 or higher are not allowed

BEGINNER 2 (majority 9 – 11; 1 ½ - 2 minutes; 8 – 16 skaters):

- CIRCLE: Include the combination move from Basic 8*
- LINE: Cover the ice, may include forward and backward skating
- BLOCK: Cover the ice, 1 or 2 configurations
- WHEEL: Wheel of choice with backward pumps
- INTERSECTION: 2 lines facing each other, 2- foot glide or 1-foot glide at point of intersection.

Restrictions:

- Additional elements are not allowed
- Holds allowed: Shoulder-to-shoulder and hand-to-hand only
- Changes of rotational direction and traveling within elements are not allowed.
- Steps or moves from Free Skate 2 or higher are not allowed

BEGINNER 3 (majority at least 12; 2 – 2 ½ minutes; 8 – 16 skaters):

- CIRCLE: Include the combination move from Basic 8*
- LINE: Cover the ice, forward and backward skating
- BLOCK: Cover the ice, 2 or 3 configurations
- WHEEL: Wheel of choice
- INTERSECTION: 2 lines facing each other, 1 foot glide or forward lunge at the point of intersection.

Restrictions:

- Changes of rotational direction and traveling within elements are not allowed.

* Combination move from Basic 8: Two forward crossovers into a forward inside Mohawk, foot down or step behind, backward crossover, step forward into forward inside edge glide.
